# Review of the Corrective Action Plan (CAP)

Item: Review of the CAP (Dr. Gail M. Fowler)

Conclusion: The State Charter School Commission (SCSC) reviewed the CAP and determined the goals set forth by administration were not rigorous enough. Cirrus Academy committed to decreasing the number of scholars scoring in the Beginning Learning category each school year, as determined by the Georgia Milestone Assessment, by 3%. Cirrus Academy also committed to increasing the number of scholars scoring the in the Developing Learner category and above each school year, as determined by the Georgia Milestone Assessment, by 3%.

## CAP (Corrective Action Plan) Benchmark Data Review

Item: Review of Benchmark data (Ms. Diane Freeman)

Conclusion: Upon review of our most recent MAP data, in comparison to the FY21 data, the scholars of Cirrus Academy have already exceeded those goals.

#### **Elementary ELA**

- 22-point decrease in scholars scoring in the Beginning Learning category
- 22-point increase in the Developing Learner category

### **Elementary Math**

- 25-point decrease in scholars scoring in the Beginning Learning category
- 25-point increase in the Developing Learner category

### Middle Grades ELA

- 11-point decrease in scholars scoring in the Beginning Learning category
- 12-point increase in the Developing Learner category

### Middle Grades Math

- 8-point decrease in scholars scoring in the Beginning Learning category
- 25-point increase in the Developing Learner category

These results were achieved by incorporating personalized learning. This includes the use of all intervention staff, small groups, working more closely with parents, ensuring paraprofessionals received the same training as the teachers so that they are able to be used more effectively, as well as track performance through the use of common assessments to name a few. Kindergarten scholars will participate in an in-house Science Fair. They will go through the process as a collective project, giving them the opportunity to practice rigor.

#### **Comments**

Item: Adoption of the packet presented, to include new rigorous practices for Cirrus Academy scholars, was approved. (Albert Rogers)

Conclusion: Unanimously approved by all committee members.
