Family Responsibilities:

- Review the Lexile goals with my scholar and read for 20 minutes a day at home for daily reading. review the math goals with my scholar and practice 10 minutes a day at home for daily math facts/skills practice.

Scholar Responsibilities:

- Ask for help if you do not understand
- Know my Lexile level and goal
- Read in my Lexile band a minimum of 5 times per week at home
- Practice math facts/skills daily at home.
- Use websites provided by my teacher to improve literacy and math.
